180° Awning to Canopy Camper & Khaya Mounting Kit (CC-A-AWN-BKT-LH)

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1. Shadow Awning Fitment – Tools, Fasteners & Materials

The tables below show the equipment, i.e. tools and fasteners required to start the Shadow Awning fitment onto a Canopy Camper or Khaya, on the left hand side.

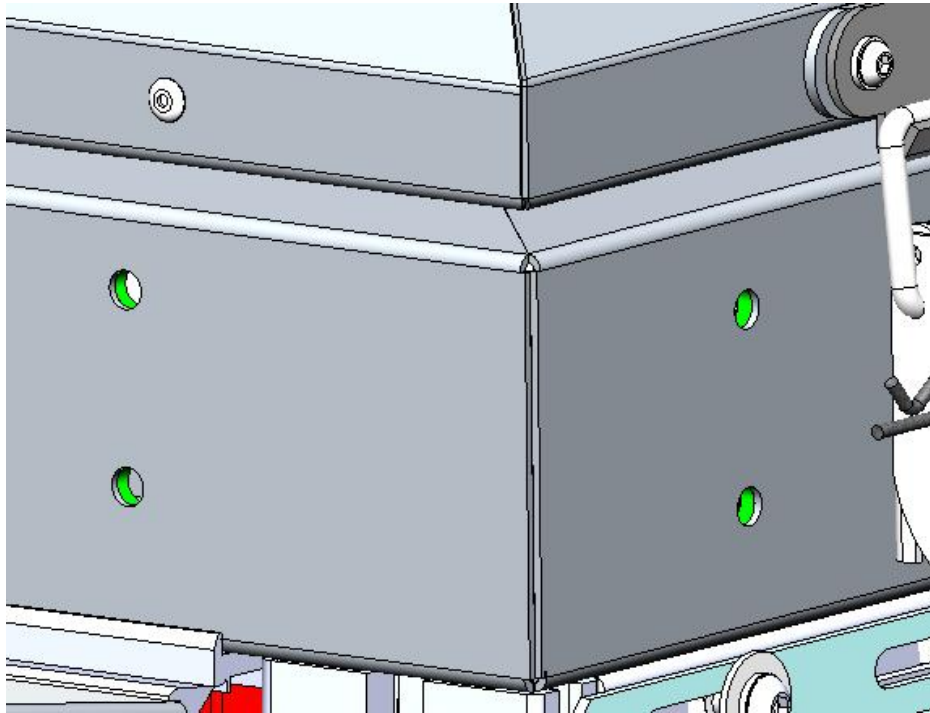

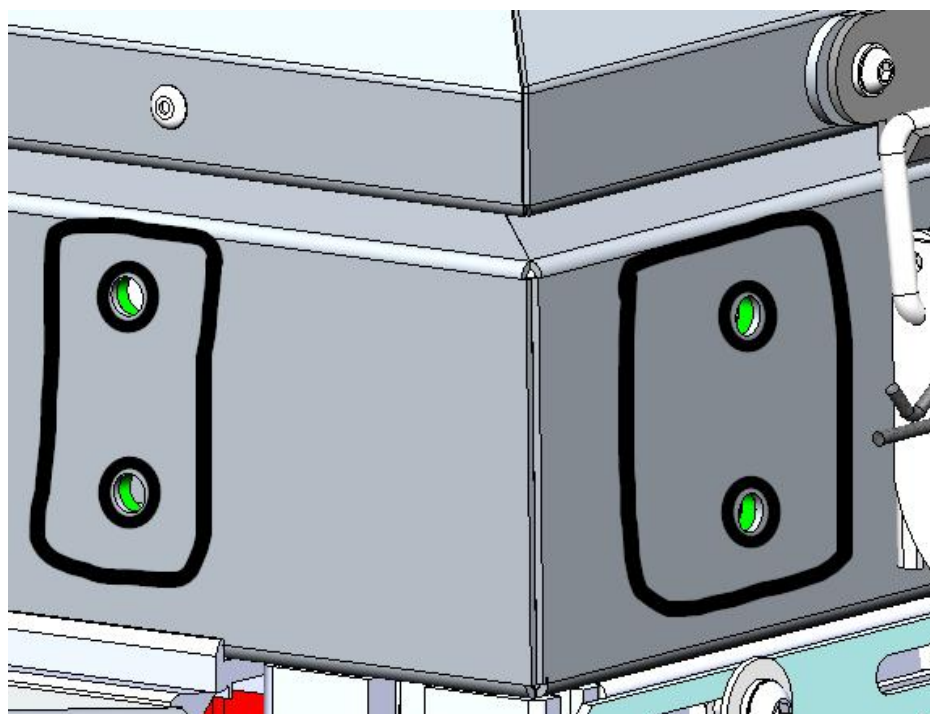

2. Fitment of Rear Mounting Bracket

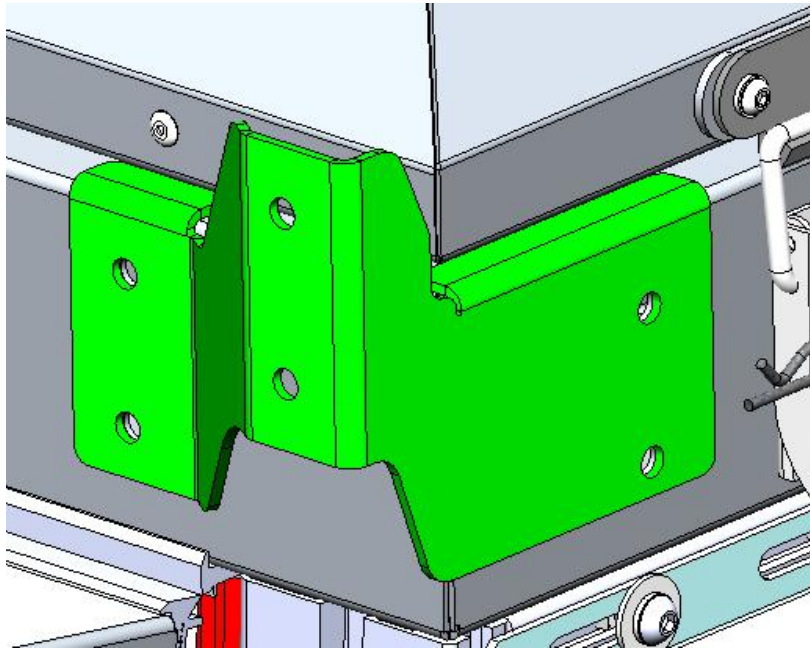
At the rear left hand corner of the Canopy Camper or Khaya, there will be four (4) laser cut holes in the base of the roof top tent, as shown in the image below:



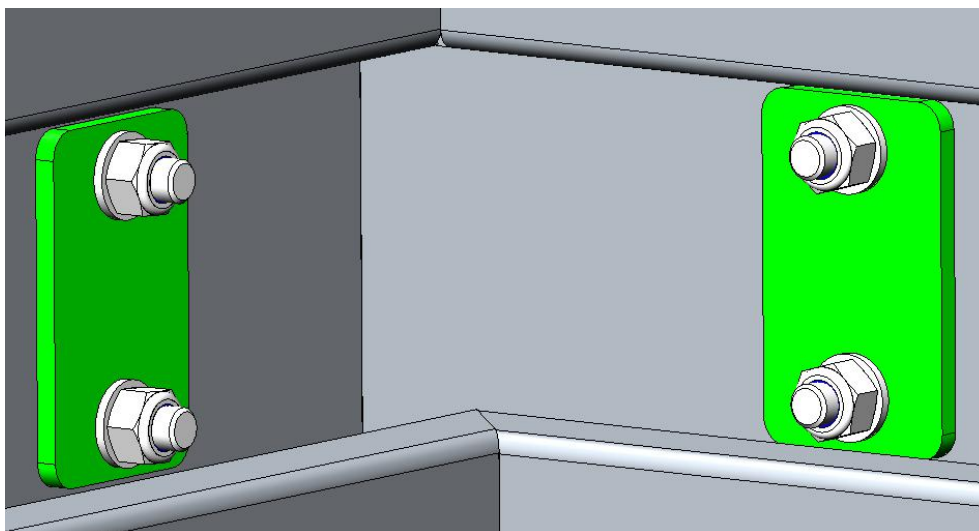
Apply unbroken beads of sealant around all of the laser cut holes, as well as making an unbroken bead around the perimeter, within the bounds of where the corner bracket will mount (AWN-CPR-000-006). See the image below:



Align Awn-CPR-000-006 with the laser cut holes at the rear left hand corner of the Canopy Camper or Khaya, as shown in the image below:



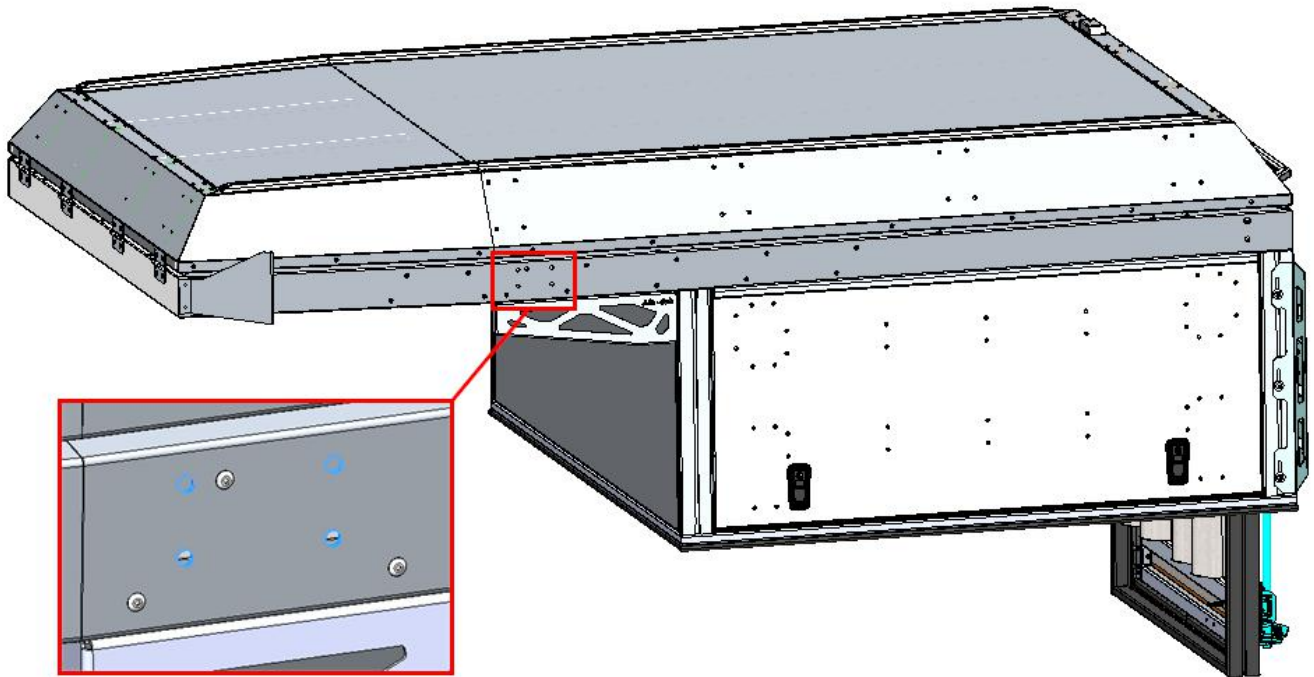
When inserting the fasteners, in the stack up order indicated under the section *Component Identification*, ensure that the two (2) plates, Awn-CPR-000-003, are aligned on the inside surface, as shown in the image below:



After tightening up the fasteners, wipe away any excess sealant that has squeezed out past the brackets, on the outside surfaces. The preferred cleaning agent is a 50-50 mixture of isopropyl alcohol and water. Refrain from using harsh chemicals, as they may damage the powder coating.

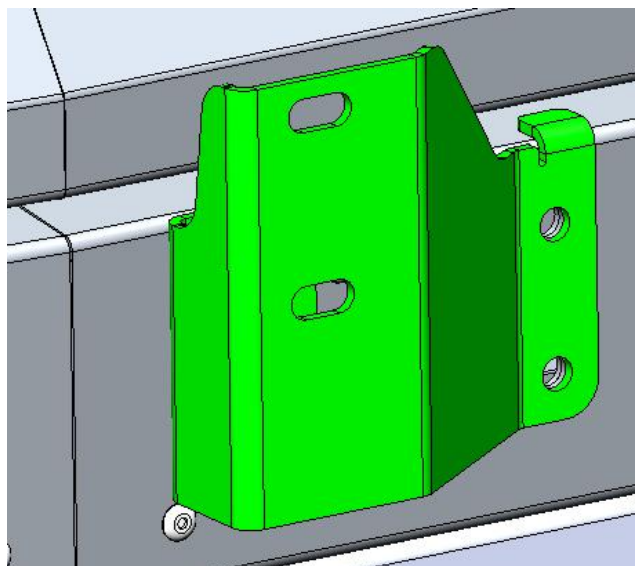
3. Fitment of Front Mounting Bracket

Locate the front four (4) laser cut holes in the roof top tent's base, as shown in the image below:



Apply unbroken beads of sealant around all of the laser cut holes, as well as making an unbroken bead around the perimeter, within the bounds of where the bracket will mount (AWN-CPR-000-007). Use the same technique, as described in *Fitment of Rear Mounting Bracket*.

Align AWN-CPR-000-007 with the laser cut holes at the front of the Canopy Camper or Khaya, as shown in the image below:

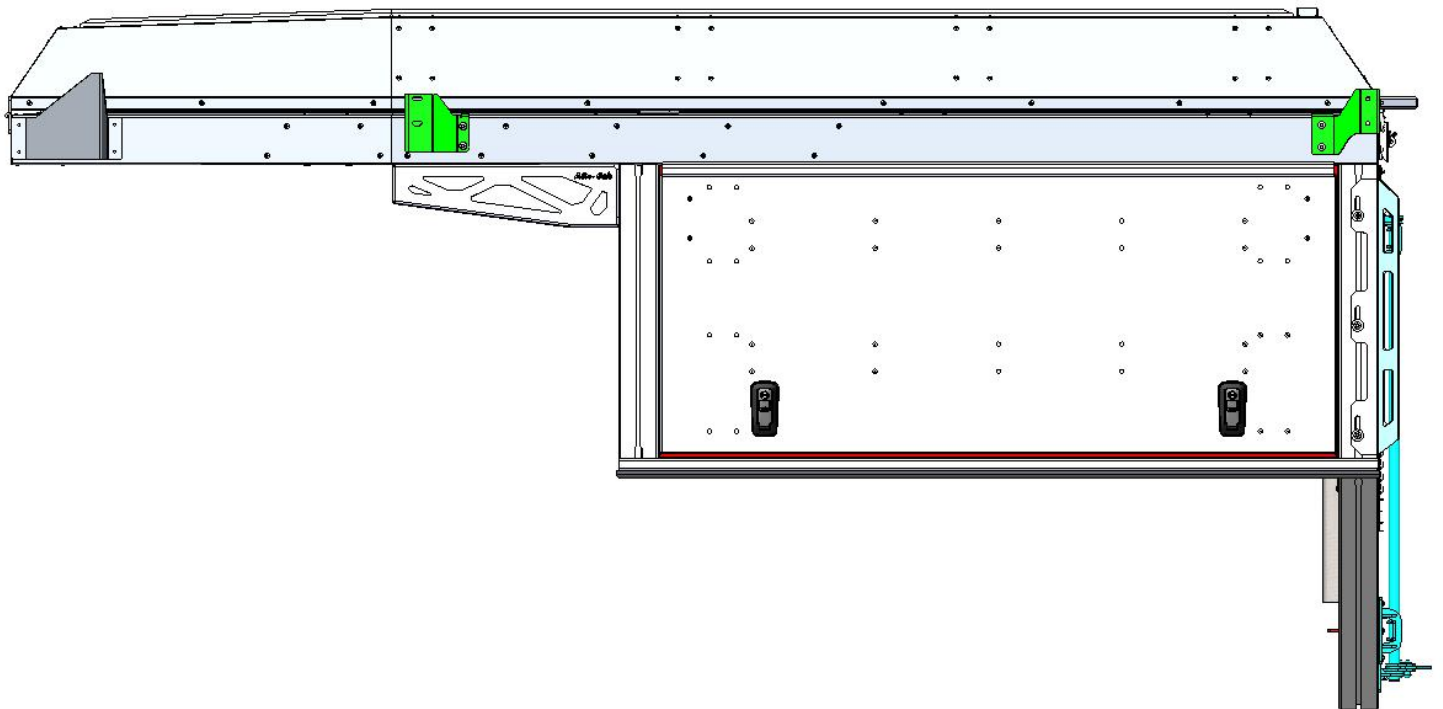


Insert the fasteners, using the information found in the section *Component Identification*, for reference.

Hex head bolts are used in the furthestmost forward two (2) holes, and Button head bolts, in the other two (2). There is no backing plate required for this bracket, as the frame of the base unit is stiffened in this area.

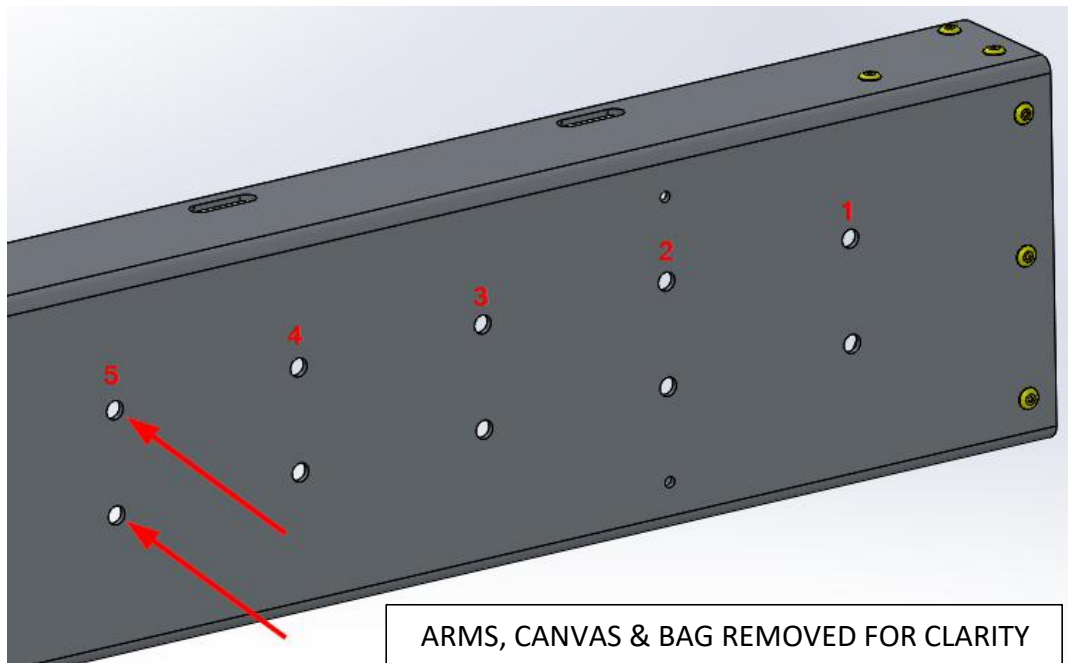
After tightening up the fasteners, wipe away any excess sealant that has squeezed out past the brackets, on the outside surfaces. The preferred cleaning agent is a 50-50 mixture of isopropyl alcohol and water. Refrain from using harsh chemicals, as they may damage the powder coating.

The mounted assembly will look like the image below:

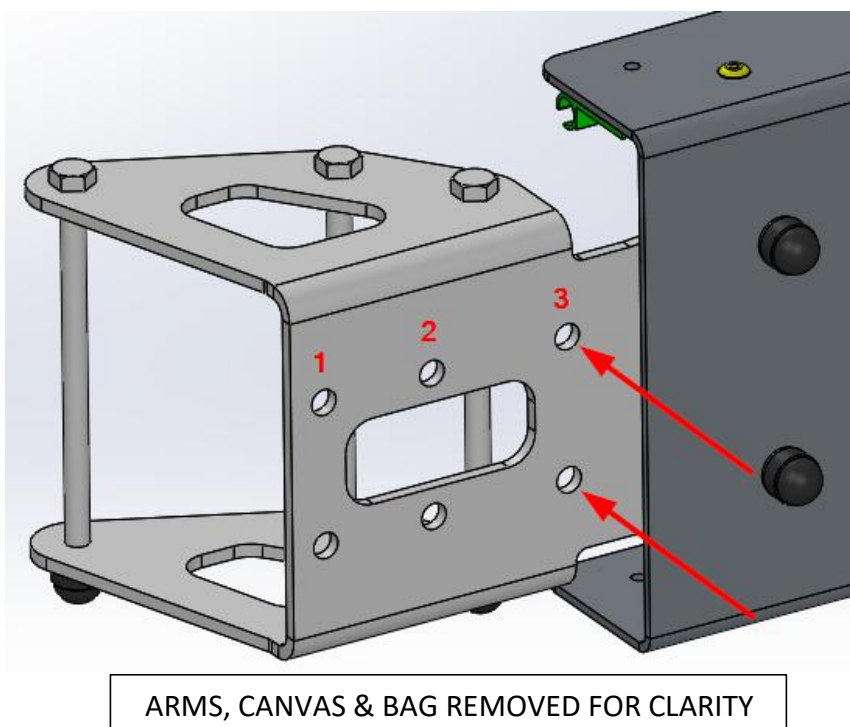


4. Fitment of Shadow Awning to Mounting Brackets

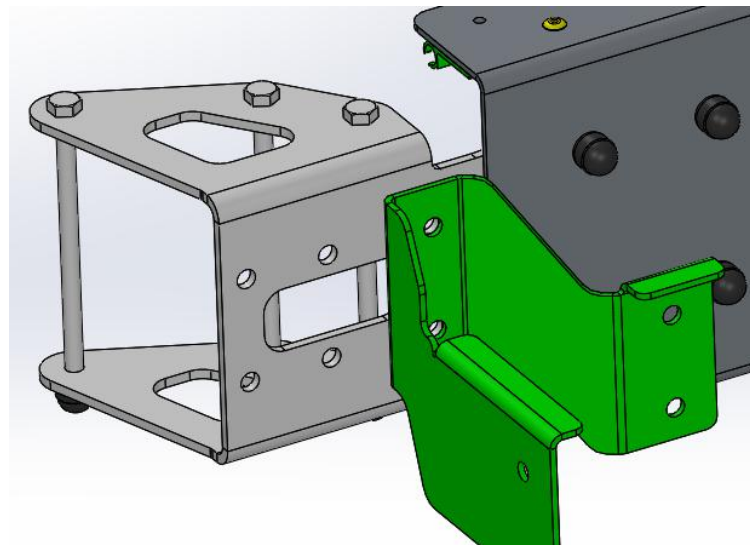
Unzip the Shadow Awning bag, and start to pivot the arms outwards, as if opening the awning fully. Count the pairs of holes, starting from the front. The bag will need to be drilled through, at hole pair five (5), as shown in the image below. Ensure that the arms, and/or canvas is safely out of the way before drilling. Use an $\Phi 8.5$ mm drill bit.



At the rear of the Shadow Awning, at the pivot point plate, count the hole pairs from the rear, and drill through the bag at hole pair three (3), as shown in the image below. Ensure that the arms, and/or canvas is safely out of the way before drilling. Use an $\Phi 8.5$ mm drill bit.

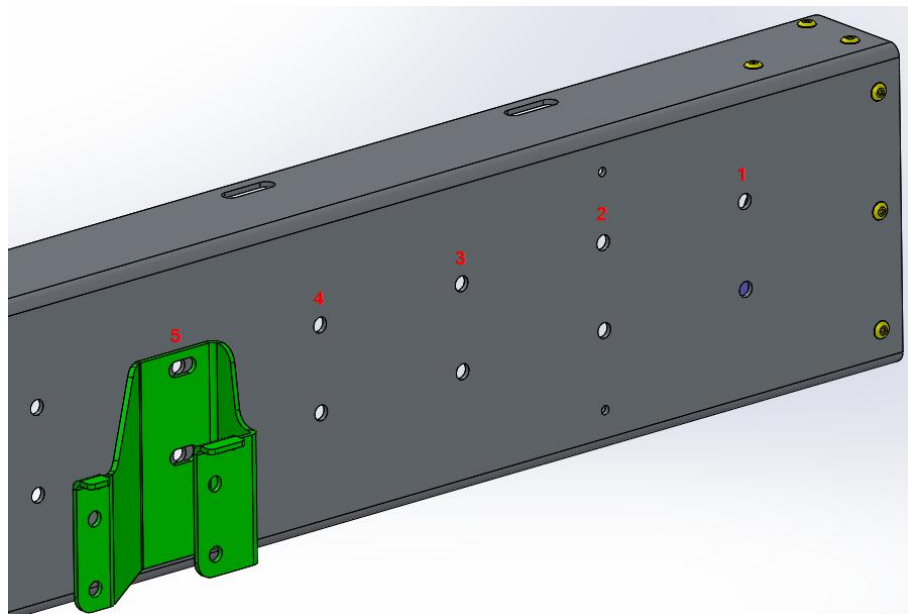


Align the rear of the Shadow Awning, with the installed rear corner bracket, as shown below. Insert the fasteners, as per the section *Component Identification*, do not fully tighten the fasteners.



COMPONENTS REMOVED FOR CLARITY

Align the front of the Shadow Awning, with the installed front bracket, as shown below. Insert the fasteners, as per the section *Component Identification*. Ensure that the awning is seated correctly, and not leaning forwards or backwards. Tighten these fasteners, and then tighten the fasteners on the rear corner bracket.



Once mounted, the awning will align with the Canopy Camper or Khaya, as shown below (Arms, canvas and bag removed for clarity):
